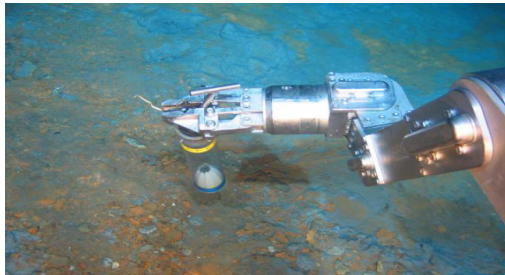


Applications open for Marine Science Short Course

Marine Science Short Course

Nautilus Minerals, in partnership with the University of Papua New Guinea and Duke University (USA), is holding the 2nd Marine Science Short Course.

The course will be held at the Kavieng Fisheries College, New Ireland Province, from October 12 - November 2, 2014.

The 3 week course will focus on:

- Invertebrate Zoology;
- Basic Oceanography;
- Building, programming and operating mini Remotely Operated Vehicles (ROVs).

Nautilus, UPNG and Duke will interview a selection of candidates with a view of selecting participants who have a keen interest in Marine Science.

Selected participants must be available to fly from Port Moresby to Kavieng on October 12. Students will spend 3 weeks at the Kavieng Fisheries College and return to Port Moresby on November 2.

To qualify for consideration you will need:

- To be in your 3rd year of a Biology, Environmental Science or Fisheries undergraduate degree;
- To have excellent English communication skills;
- To hold valid identification documents, required for travel.

To apply for this exciting opportunity, please include the following documents in your application:

- Letter of application;
- Short essay (500 words or less) explaining why you would like to attend this course and how the course will help further your studies and career;
- Resume / Curriculum Vitae;
- Reference from your immediate supervisor; and
- A copy of your academic transcripts/records.

25 positions are available, of those, 20 spots will be reserved for students from UPNG and 5 positions for students from the wider South Pacific community.

Nautilus Minerals will cover all costs associated with the course including travel and accommodation.
